extreme weather, including floods and wild fires. Governments of rich countries have been rolling back policies intended to address global warming, and some political parties deny climate science.

Polls show that the proportion of people concerned about climate change has fallen from 68% to 60% and support for the UK target hitting net-zero by 2050 has decreased from 62% to a concerning 46%.
